Art comes to life at Whitsunday Reef Festival

WEARABLE art is a growing worldwide phenomenon and the Whitsundays have their very own wearable art fashion parade each year as part of the Whitsunday Reef Festival (August 5-14). The theme this year is "Finding the Reef", which can be interpreted in a number of different ways, and the Wilmar Wearable Art Parade and judging will take place on Saturday August 13 at the PCYC and on the Airlie Beach foreshore.

Described as "the painted canvas come to life", Wearable Art can be sewn, constructed, glued, painted, collaged, riveted, woven and knitted – and just about anything else your imagination dreams up! In the Whitsundays, lack of imagination is certainly not a problem, with last year's entries a kaleidoscope of colourful ribbons, streamers and tinsel, with everything from clocks to newspapers incorporated into the outfits.

"Every year the entrants never fail to amaze me with their ingenuity," festival organiser Margie Murphy said. "Outfits can be made from metals, recycled objects, silk, rubber, natural fibres or industrial offcuts – there really is no limit to what you can create and the materials you can use to make it".
