STUDY EDUCATION THROUGH RATEP

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander teacher training opportunities in Mackay

RATEP is a community-based teacher education program that provides a direct pathway for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in remote, rural and regional Queensland locations to become registered teachers or qualified teacher aides.

The RATEP program is a partnership between TAFE Queensland north region, Queensland Department of Education and James Cook University.

Students can apply to enrol at TAFE Queensland north region in the following courses.

QUALIFICATIONS

> **CERTIFICATE III IN ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER EDUCATION** 10751NAT

Get a head start on your teaching career with this entry-level qualification. This course is offered to both high school students and adult learners.

Adult students can study full time for one year or part time for two years.

High school students (Year 11, Year 12) can study part time and earn eight points towards their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

Course starts Monday **7 February 2022**.

> **DIPLOMA OF ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER EDUCATION** 10753NAT

Successful completion of this course will qualify you to seek work as a teaching assistant.

Study full time for one year or part time for two years.

Course starts Monday **7 February 2022**.

Graduates of the Diploma of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education (10753NAT) qualification can gain credit for one full year of the Bachelor of Education at James Cook University.
